



Physical Education and Sports Premium

General information

The Government has allocated funding (2013 - 2014 and 2014 - 2015) for additional primary school sport in schools.

This funding must be used to improve the quality of Physical Education (P.E) and Sport for all of our pupils.

The sport funding is ring fenced which means that it can only be spent on PE and sport provision in school.

How the funding is spent at Cheslyn Hay Primary School

We use a portion of this funding to support football coaching at lunchtime for identified vulnerable pupils and this has proved to be extremely effective and successful. In 2012 - 2013 a programme of football coaching was delivered to some of our year 6 boys. This enabled us to further develop the 'Respect' agenda and help them to work with each other to improve behaviour and raise self-esteem. In 2013 - 2014 we have identified year 3 as a group which might benefit from organised games/coaching to support the transition from KS1 and again improve self-esteem.

Who is responsible for managing this and delivering a quality sports and P.E programme?

Mr Craig Stanworth is our P.E Co-ordinator and she ensures that the P.E curriculum is fit for purpose and meets the needs of our pupils. The pupils take part in 2 hours of physical activity each week working through a challenging curriculum appropriate for all abilities.

Working with the Cheslyn Hay Primary Cluster

We have formed a strong working relationship with our Primary Cluster and Cheslyn Hay High school and a package of P.E and Sports Coaching has been developed using funding from Sports Premium.

This includes:

- Membership of a local cluster/family of schools
- Reviewing current practice and quality marking provision.
- Access to nationally recognised Quality Mark status
- Updates on Ofsted Sport Premium criteria
- Sustainability of regular network contact
- Local festivals and competition calendars
- Needs led calendar of CPD opportunities
- Leadership training opportunities
- Recruitment of young leaders from Secondary schools to support events
- Access to locally organised provision for Gifted and Talented pupils.

We have allocated 6 - 9 days per year for the PLT (Mr Stanworth) to have time to develop the Cluster programme, attend Cluster meetings and develop and embed work in our school.
